



Bishop Neville Campbell

Bishop Neville Campbell is the Sr. Pastor of First Providence Baptist Church, Freeport, Bahamas. He is a native of Lowe Sound, Andros, Bahamas. On April 1, 1973 he accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior.

Bishop Campbell is the former Pastor of Freeport Mission Baptist Church, pastor Executive Secretary of the Mission Baptist Consortium of Churches, and the founding pastor of First Providence Baptist Church, Freeport, Bahamas. He served as a Family Counsellor at the Department of Social Services and as the Director of the Congress of Christian Education for the Conference of the Bahamas Baptist Union of Churches.

He studied at the American Baptist College, Nashville, Tennessee, earning a Bachelor of Arts degree. He continued studies in the Master of Arts program at Tennessee State University, and later earned a Master of Divinity degree from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. He completed Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) at Humana Hospital, University of Louisville, Kentucky.

Bishop Campbell was awarded the Clyde T. Francisco Preaching Excellence award in September 1984 at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He appeared several times on the Dean's List at American Baptist College and was nominated for the National Dean's List in 1982 and 1983 in Nashville, Tennessee. His first book, "Baptized in the Fire", was published on June 2000. His works in progress include "Not a Whole Family"; "A Theology of Waiting"; "God's Blessing on a Generation"; and "Joining God".

Presently, Bishop Campbell teaches Religious Studies at Jack Hayward Junior High School, Freeport, Bahamas. He was married to the former Demetria D. Simmons (deceased) and they have five children: Nequita, Nerissa, Navise, Neville, Jr. and Natalia, who is presently studying at LeMoyne Owen College. He also has seven grandchildren.
